#### Fund structure

The Fund is an authorised unit trust scheme under the Financial Services & Markets Act 2000 and also a UCITS scheme as defined by the Collective Investment Schemes Sourcebook. The Fund is open-ended and issues Accumulation (Acc) and Income (Inc) units.

## **Objective**

The investment objective of the Fund is to seek to achieve a total return, calculated on an income reinvested basis, greater than the Deutsche Numis Smaller Companies Index (excluding Investment Companies) over the long term, with the focus on rolling five year periods.


## **Investment style: Value**

Aberforth are value investors who buy shares in companies that they calculate to be selling below their intrinsic value. This is determined through detailed financial and industrial analysis, combined with a valuation approach that focuses on both stockmarket and corporate worth.

## Monthly investment commentary: December

The US equity market paused for breath in December following a strong year that was turbocharged by Donald Trump's victory in the Presidential Election. UK equities also had a lacklustre month as the market continued to digest October's business-unfriendly Budget.

The FTSE All Share fell by 1.2% in the month, while smaller companies were more robust with the DNSCI (XIC) up by 0.3%. For the year as a whole, both the large cap and small cap indices were up by a respectable 9.5%. Such a return seemed unlikely to many at the end of 2023 given the collective gloominess about the outlook for the UK. The Fund returned 0.2% in December and 11.8% for the year.


Among positive contributors to performance in a quiet month for news was annuity company **Just Group**. It is benefiting from a busy bulk annuities market, as defined benefit pension funds look to take advantage of funding surpluses. Pub group **Marston's** posted strong results thanks to healthy like-for-like sales and pointed to Christmas bookings being ahead of the previous year. London-based estate agent **Foxtons'** share price recovered from the post-budget fall as housing activity data remained buoyant.

**Videndum**, a provider of products to the content creation market, detracted from performance. Its market is experiencing a slower recovery following the 2023 Hollywood writers' strike. During the first half of 2025, the company will seek to amend banking covenants and to refinance its borrowing facilities. **ZIGUP** posted weaker than expected results as the normalisation of residual values reduced disposal profits in its vehicle rental business. Profittaking affected the shares of **CMC Markets** during the month.



#### **Data sources & calculations**

All data supplied by Aberforth, except DNSCI (XIC) data (from Numis/Paul Marsh and Elroy Dimson – London Business School) and FTSE data (from FTSE International Limited).

Performance returns are total returns after all expenses and assume reinvestment of dividends. Yield is based on the Fund's trailing 12 months' dividends. Active share is a measure of how the Fund's portfolio differs from the DNSCI (XIC). Small companies are represented by the DNSCI (XIC).
